National Youth Stampede 2019

A slightly smaller number of entrants in the National Charolais Youth Stampede allowed a more one on one educational program. Seven Pee Wees, 12 Juniors, 21 Intermediates and 14 Seniors received an education program during the Stampede. The committee ran a program highly orientated to education within the cattle industry as well as personal development.

One of the pleasing aspects of the Youth Stampede is watching friendships evolve within the groups. Contestants that may start clinging to family on arrival quickly become incorporated into their groups and work together in many activities. This year we used the resources of New South Wales Department of Agriculture to deliver education sessions on personal development, respect and future agricultural entry pathways. These sessions were heavily targeted to the appropriate age group. This included activities such as paper plane making and flying to assist in the sessions.

In junior judging programs Rebecca Keeley, Chenu Charolais and Glenn Trout, Kenmere Charolais gave informative presentations on how they select and appraise cattle before the contestants competed in their own right.

The Pee Wee section used a large picture of a bull with Velcro dots to show important parts of animal structure. Descriptive terms were placed on the photograph as they learned the terminology. These entrants continued this exercise well after their session concluded before judging two heifers in competition.

The Pee Wee group also collaborated with Sapphire Halliday to produce a unique Charolais artwork that later sold to Andrew and Anne Thompson for \$650.

The senior section placed two classes of animals and then all competitors had the chance to deliver their oral reasons on their placement. Most age groups had some public speaking practice.

Intermediates and seniors had assignments to complete based on animal selection and future breeding programs. These assignments were based on practical real life opportunities and used the cattle at the venue.

A huge vote of appreciation to Nicole Nicholls and Nattel Kempf who structured the youth education program with the assistance of the committee. Also thank you to all educational presenters and their assistants, these programs work so well due to your contribution.
